Office of Regional Stewardship announces launch of Accelerate Series business roundtables.

The Northern Kentucky University Office of Regional Stewardship announced today the launch of its Accelerate Series with Kickstart! Business Roundtables beginning this month.

The free breakfast series features lively conversations and facilitated discussions designed to give business and nonprofit leaders the opportunity to learn about timely topics, share their accumulated wisdom and network with other regional business leaders.

The first in the third-Friday spring 2010 series is titled "Green in Organizations" and will take place on Jan. 15 from 7:30-9 a.m. in Room 109 of NKU's Student Union. Additional series topics will include generations in the workplace, recession recovery, social media and succession planning.

The NKU Accelerate Series officially kicks off in February with the launch of new noncredit certificate programs in applied supervision, information management for the 21st century, business process analysis and health informatics technology.

Accelerate grew out of NKU's outreach to the business and nonprofit community via systematic interviews with company CEO's to understand their company's growth drivers and hurdles. Accelerate programs offer unique professional development opportunities for professionals who are especially hard hit by today's economy.
